Knox Presbyterian Book Drive Sunday, April 28th Early reading opens up children's minds to the world around them, encourages them to explore new goals and reach their full scholastic potential. The Kiwanis Club of St. Thomas Golden K and "Investing in Children" have formed a partnership to improve the reading skills of children from infancy to young adulthood in the St. Thomas-Elgin area. In this program, new and gently used books will be offered to children in "Blue Boxes for Books" set up in numerous locations throughout St. Thomas- Elgin. Many children in this area do not have books in their homes that they can call their own and "Blue Boxes for Books" allows children to take a book, read the book and keep the book for their very own if they wish.

A vital part of this program is the collection of gently used children's books to be vetted, cleaned and recycled into the Blue Boxes. The Kiwanis Golden K Club is inviting Knox members to participate in the **Book Drive next Sunday on April 28**th by donating used children's books (baby to young adult) or new books. Containers for collecting books will be in the front and rear entrances or if you forget, collection boxes will be inside the front office door during the rest of the week.

By contributing your books to this program you are giving families and children in our area an opportunity to develop strong literacy skills and capabilities that last a life-time. The children thank you for your assistance.

to a fun, hour-long Saturday afternoon concert for the young and young at heart featuring musicians from El Sistema Aeolian in London and Knox Presbyterian Church in St. Thomas! The event is a pay-what-you-can donation, with all proceeds going to El Sistema Aeolian.

What is El Sistema? El Sistema Aeolian is a free, intensive after-school music program based on a program founded in Venezuela in 1975. Each El Sistema program is free to adapt its delivery in a way that is unique to its community, resources, and participants. The initiative has grown to include programs in over 80 countries and has won TED, UNESCO, and Glenn Gould Awards.

When did it come to the London area? The Aeolian Hall Musical Arts Association launched El Sistema Aeolian in November of 2011, serving 20 children in the pilot project, which has grown to 130 spots offered during the 2022-2023 academic year. The goal of El Sistema Aeolian is to hold the tension between musical and social outcomes. There is a social curriculum, leadership class, and students do mindfulness training at The Indonesian Gamelan. A food program offers participants regular nourishment and opportunities to broaden their culinary experience. Participants perform regularly with artists presented on the Aeolian stage including names like The Canadian Brass, Royal Wood, Valdy, Ashley McIsaac, Matt Alber, and Ty Herndon.

What will the concert feature? The program is approximately one hour long. It features Knox's own Shantanu Thaivalappil singing "Peter and the Wolf", El Sistema Aeolian's Director Darren Sigesmund playing jazz on the piano, and youth from EL Sistema Aeolian in the ESA Woodwind trio playing "The Queen's Farewell" and "The Flower Duet".
